Nomad Visit: Ride up into the high Lhagang grasslands, stopping for lunch with a nomadic family. Enjoy the silence and the whistling of nomads for hours. (6 hours with lunch)

Grasslands and Buddhism Ride: Ride up onto the high plateau and visit a meditation retreat cave (currently empty). Then onto Nyelum Temple for a full tour of the old thangka paintings there. (English-speaking guide a must for the full experience.) (6 hours with lunch)

Nomad Tent and Hut Stays

Nomad Homestay Hikes 2 days

Self-guided: Walk, following a map, to visit nomads, and stay the night with them in their tents. Enjoy the afternoon herding yaks and seeing the area, and try milking yaks in the morning. Walk back in the morning by the same route, or by the road and highway. (3-6 hours walk each day, depending on season.)

Nomad-Pathfinder-Guided:: Walk up to the nomad camps with a Tibetan pathfinding guide to take you places you otherwise may not be able to find! Enjoy the afternoon herding yaks and seeing the area, and try milking yaks in the morning. Walk back the next day on your own. (3-6 hours walk depending on season.)

Fully-guided: Spend 2 full days with an English speaking Tibetan guide, who will tell you local stories, give you a full temple and art tour at Nyelum Gompa, tell you the local hermit tales, and translate between you and the nomad family. The first day is a full day hike to enable more interesting sites. The second day can be half or full day (no price difference), depending on your energy levels and interest.

Nomad Homestay and Horse Rides 2 days

Nomad Homestay with 1-Day Ride and Walk Back: Ride up into the high Lhagang grasslands, stopping for a temple visit and lunch with a nomadic family - or, if the weather is nice, have a grassland picnic. Stay the night with a nomadic family, and walk back unguided over the same route the next day. (6 hours ride, 3 hours walk. Includes lunch, dinner, bed, breakfast, horses, and horse guide.)

Nomad Homestay and Visit to Gyergo Nunnery, 2 Days Riding: Ride up into the high Lhagang grasslands, stopping for a temple visit and lunch with a nomadic family - or, if the weather is nice, have a grassland picnic. Stay the night with a nomadic family. The following day, try milking yaks in the morning and then ride on to Gyergo Nunnery. Visit the sights there - the temple, mani wall, and newly built monk's college. You need to return to the lodge on your own or stay in a homestay here. (6 hours ride each day. Includes lunch, dinner, bed, and breakfast, horses, and horse guide. With additional night at Gyergo add Y160.)

Nomad Tent Stay, Gyergo Nunnery, and Meituk Lake Trek 3 days, ride or hike

Ride up into the high Lhagang grasslands, stopping for a temple visit and lunch with a nomadic family - or, if the weather is nice, have a grassland picnic. Stay the night with a nomadic family. The following day, try milking yaks in the morning and then ride on to Gyergo Nunnery. Visit the sights there - the temple, mani wall, and monk's college. Stay the night with a family at Gyergo, and the next day ride up to high Meituk Tso, a lake with gorgeous high peak views. Have lunch at the lake and then ride back to Lhagang. (6 hours ride each day and 2 home stays included. Includes all meals, beds, guiding, and horses (if riding). No packhorses.

**This trek requires at least 2 full days acclimatization. It is strenuous and at high altitude, sleeping at 4550 meters.

Ride or hike high onto the plateau to Yibei Lake, and back around the following day. Day 1: Set out early for Yibei Lake, stopping at the high nomad camps during the day. Day 2: Return to the lodge across the high open plateau. (7-8 hours ride or hike per day. Includes meals and camping, packhorses, riding horses if riding, and guides. Sleeping bags and mats can be rented for an extra fee.)

Learn yak milking and rope making, and then set out for Yibei Lake, a deep sinkhole lake in the highest part of the Lhagang grasslands. Day 3: Ride or hike back to the ecolodge, across wide grasslands. Includes meals, tents, guides. Sleeping bags and mats can be rented.

Day 1: Set out early for Yibei Lake, a deep sinkhole lake in the highest part of the Lhagang grasslands. Day 2: Ride or hike across high wetland, filled with wild birds, to an overlook to the north and west, and get a sense of the scope of the land. Visit sacred Ragni Lake, another sinkhole, and camp nearby. Day 3: Ride or hike to Genup Gumpa, an original small nomad temple on the edge of the high plateau. Meet a car this evening to return to Tagong or the ecolodge. Includes meals, tents, guides, and car. Sleeping bags and mats can be rented.

High Plateau Lake Trek 4 days, Ride or Hike

Trek far into the grasslands west of Lhagang.

Day 1: Set out for Yibei Lake, a deep sinkhole lake in the highest part of the Lhagang grasslands. Day 2: Ride or hike across high wetland, filled with wild birds, to a overlook to the north and west, and get a sense of the scope of the land. Visit sacred Ragni Lake, another sinkhole, and camp nearby. Day 3: Ride or hike to Genup Gompa, an original small nomad temple on the edge of the high plateau. Day 4, return to the Khampa Nomad Ecolodge on foot or by horse, crossing deep valleys and high hills. Includes meals, guide, horses (riding or packing), and tents. Sleeping bags and mats can be rented.

Trek far into the grasslands west of Lhagang to an isolated self-sufficient village on a lake.

Day 1: Set out for Badi Temple, a small isolated nomad temple. Visit the temple and camp nearby. Day 2: Ride past many lakes and visit a small hermitage retreat. Then drop down into a side valley for the night. Day 3: Ride or hike back up onto the plateau, crossing high ridges, some of which require you to lead your horse carefully. Camp by the big Drapa Lake, and a small nomadic village. Day 4: Ride or hike back out of the valley, across the highlands, and then bushwhack, again leading your horse, past cliff lakes, to a small farming village below. Visit the temple and camp nearby. Day 5: Climb back up onto the high plateau and ride or hike to Yibei Lake, a deep sinkhole high on the plateau. Day 6: Ride or hike to a high lookout, and then end at a nomad camp, where you will spend the night. Day 7: Ride or hike back to Khampa Nomad Ecolodge. Includes meals, guide, horses (riding or packing), and tents. Sleeping bags and mats can be rented.

Zhakra Hotsprings Out and Back Trek 2 days, ride or hike

Meet in the morning at Gyergo Nunnery. Ride or hike up over Griffon Pass (4800 meters) and down to Zhakra Hot springs, and the base of the high peak. Stay the night in tents there. Day 2, ride or hike back up over the pass and visit Meituk lake on your way to the meeting point with a road. (Horse riding 6-7 hours per day, hiking 8-9 hours per day. As a hike, this is strenuous. Horse riding is medium difficulty with some hiking required. Includes all meals, horses (either riding or pack-horses), guiding, tents, and car from Ecolodge or Tagong (one way). Sleeping bags and pads can be rented for an extra charge.

Zhakra Hotsprings and Yimtso Lake Trek

3 days, ride or hike

Meet in the morning at Gyergo Nunnery. Ride or hike up over Griffon Pass (4800 meters) and down to Zhakra Hot springs, and the base of the high peak. Stay the night in tents there. Day 2: Ride or hike down the valley to the forest. Set up camp there and take an afternoon trek up to see the sacred turquoise lake, Zhakra Yimtso. With an English-speaking guide, you'll hear many local stories and legends, and learn about the meditation retreat area above the lake. (This lake has become part of a new park, with a paved road part of the way. It requires entry ticket of Y100, and is subject to park opening and rules). Day 3: Ride back over a gentle pass to Gyergo Nunnery. If you still have energy, tour the nunnery this afternoon. (Horse riding 6-7 hours per day, hiking 8-9 hours per day. As a hike, this is strenuous. Horse riding is medium difficulty with some hiking required. Includes all meals, horses (either riding or pack-horses), guiding, tents, and car from Ecolodge or Tagong (one way). Sleeping bags and pads can be rented for an extra charge.

Semi-technical with lots of wildlife**

3 days, ride or hike (day 2 hiking only)

Meet in the morning at Gyergo Nunnery. Ride or hike up over Griffon Pass (4800 meters) and down to Zhakra Hot springs, and the base of the high peak. Stay the first night in tents there. Day 2, leave the horses, and hike up toward the high glacier. Cross another high, rocky pass with close views of the glacier. Then drop down and camp near a small lake below. Many wild animals and their tracks in this area. Day 3, ride or hike across the grasslands pack to Gyergo Nunnery. Afternoon visit to the nunnery sky burial, meditation cave, and temples. (Best in Summer. Horse riding 6-7 hours per day, hiking 8-9 hours per day. As a hike, this is very strenuous, for the very fit. Horse riding is medium difficulty with hiking required, particularly on the high rocky pass on day 2. Includes food, food preparation, guide, horse or packhorse, and car one-way from Ecolodge or Tagong. Tents are also provided. Sleeping bags and mats can be rented.

***with glacier day

4 days, ride or hike (day 2 hiking only)

Meet in the morning at Gyergo Nunnery. Ride or hike up over Griffon Pass (4800 meters) and down to Zhakra Hot springs, and the base of the high peak. Stay the first night in tents there. Day 2, leave the horses, and take a day hike up toward the high glacier. Many wild animals and their tracks in this area. Return to the hot spring for another lovely evening in the hot water. Day 3, Ride or hike down the valley to the forest. Set up camp there and take an afternoon trek up to see the sacred turquoise lake, Zhakra Yimtso. With an English-speaking guide, you'll hear many local stories and legends, and learn about the meditation retreat area above the lake. (This lake has become part of a new park, with a paved road part of the way. It requires entry ticket of Y100, and is subject to park opening and rules). Day 4: Ride back over a gentle pass to Gyergo Nunnery. If you still have energy, do an afternoon visit to the nunnery sky burial, meditation cave, and temples. (Best in Summer. Horse riding 6-7 hours per day, hiking 8-9 hours per day. As a hike, this is very strenuous, for the very fit. Horse riding is medium difficulty with hiking required, particularly on the high rocky pass on day 2. Includes food, food preparation, guide, horse or packhorse, and car one-way from Ecolodge or Tagong. Tents are also provided. Sleeping bags and mats can be rented.

Yala Valley to Gyergo Nunnery Trek Via Yimtso Lake and hot spring

4 days/4 nights, ride or hike

***This one way trek meets near Kangding and includes a night a hot spring hotel near there.

Arrive the day before the start of the trek and stay in a hot spring hotel at the start of the trek. Day 1, Ride or hike a steep, forested trail to an open campsite. Day 2, Ride or Hike to Zhakra Yimtso, a sacred turquoise lake. With an English-speaking guide, you'll hear many local stories and legends, and learn about the meditation retreat area above the lake. (This lake has become part of a new park, with a paved road part of the way. It requires entry ticket of Y100, and is subject to park opening and rules). Stay in a low forested area with views of the high glaciers. Day 3, Ride or hike to Zhakra Hot Springs, a fully natural medicinal spring, at the base of the high peak. Enjoy the waters. Day 4, Ride or hike up over Griffon Pass (4800 meters) to Gyergo Nunnery. This is a big day! If you still have energy, do an afternoon visit to the nunnery sky burial, meditation cave, and temples. (Best in Summer. Horse riding 6-7 hours per day, hiking 8-9 hours per day. As a hike, this is very strenuous, for the very fit. Includes hotel the night before, food, food preparation, guide, horse or packhorse, and car one-way from Ecolodge or Tagong. Tents are also provided. Sleeping bags and mats can be rented.

One way – Yala Valley to Gyergo Nunnery

*the closest we come to a kora of the peak

5 days, ride or hike

Meet at Zhonggu Village, the hot springs near Kangding. Then ride or hike up a steep forested trail to an open campsite. Day 2, leave the horses and hike into a side valley with lakes just at the base of the Zhakra. This valley is known as Yeti Valley and is very little visited. It is mainly on talus fields, and those with no experience walking on talus rocks are not recommended to do this trek. Day 3, hike or ride down toward Yimsto, the sacred turquoise lake. Do a traditional kora of the lake, visiting meditation huts. With an English-speaking guide, you'll hear many local stories and legends, and learn about the meditation retreat area above the lake. (This lake has become part of a new park, with a paved road part of the way. It requires entry ticket of Y100, and is subject to park opening and rules). Day 4: Ride or hike to the Zhakra Hotsprings, completing your 3/4 kora of the peak. Enjoy bathing in the springs as your reward. Day 5: Ride or hike over high (4880 meter) Griffon Pass, pass to Gyergo Nunnery. Ride or hike up over Griffon Pass (4800 meters) to Gyergo Nunnery. This is a big day! If you still have energy, do an afternoon visit to the nunnery sky burial, meditation cave, and temples.

Best in Summer. Horse riding 6-7 hours per day, hiking 8-9 hours per day. As a hike, this is very strenuous, for people in good shape. Horse riding is medium difficulty with some hiking required.

Danba Village to Zhakra Turquoise Lake and Hotsprings

5 days, ride or hike

Meet at Maoniu Village the night before the start of the trek, and stay in a village guesthouse. Day 1: ride or hike up the Maoniu Valley to a midway camp. Day 2: Continue the hike or ride up the valley to the twin lakes in the Zhakra Basin. Day 3: Ride or hike down to the sacred Turquoise Lake, and do a kora of the lake. With an English-speaking guide, you'll hear many local stories and legends, and learn about the meditation retreat area above the lake. (This lake has become part of a new park, with a paved road part of the way. It requires entry ticket of Y100, and is subject to park opening and rules). Then continue down and up to the hotsprings. Day 4: Do a day hike to the glacier above the hotsprings, and camp a second night at the springs. Day 5: Hike or ride over high Griffon Pass (4800 meters) to Gyergo Nunnery. (Best in Summer. Horse riding 6-7 hours per day, hiking 8-9 hours per day. Includes night at Maoniu, food, food preparation, guide, horse and packhorse, and car to return to Ecolodge or Tagong. Tents are also provided. Sleeping bags and mats can be rented.

Mount Gongka Horse Pack Trips - Ride or Hike

Mount Gongka Trek starting to the southwest 6.5 days, ride or hike

Day 1: Meet in the village of Pengbuxi in the afternoon. Stay the night in a small family guesthouse. Day 2: Drive through lovely valleys and finally up and across high passes to Tsemei Village. Lunch with the family here and meet your guide. Walk or ride this afternoon to Gongka Monastery. This small monastery is the major base camp for Gongka Peak climbs, and offers great sunset views of the peak. Day 3. Today is a long hike or ride to the Yulongxi Village winter pasture in the Buchi valley. It starts in live oak and climbs into high grassland. We stay in a small herding hut here.

Day 4: Today is a shorter trek with an option for a glacial dip at lunchtime. Camp high in preparation for crossing the pass the next morning. Day 5: A lovely day trek over the high Riwoche Pass (4950 m) and across permafrost to a glacial lake with impressive moraines. Camp below the lake.

Day 6: Hike down to a camp in lower Riwoche Valley, a camp for a caterpillar fungus diggers. Day 7: Hike through lovely temperate forest to Laoyulin. Catch a car here to Kangding city.

(This area is very busy in summer; fall or spring are best (non-holidays)). Horse riding 6-7 hours per day, hiking 8-9 hours per day. Includes night at Pengbuxi, food, food preparation, guide, horse (if riding) and packhorse, and cars from Pengbuxi and to Kangding. Tents are also provided. Sleeping bags and mats can be rented.

Yak packing also allows for higher luggage allowance for guests, and a dining tent, nice seats, and evening drinks. The most comfortable travel on the grasslands — plus yaks are charming!

**This trek requires at least 2 full days acclimatization. It is at high altitude, sleeping at 4550 meters.

Ride high onto the plateau to Yibei Lake, and back around the following day.

Day 1: Meet your yaks in the morning at the lodge, and help with packing. Set out early for Yibei Lake, stopping at the high nomad camps during the day. Day 2: Return to the lodge across the high open plateau. (7-8 hours ride per day. Includes meals and camping, pack yaks, yak packing and horse tack up instruction, horses, and horse and yak men, and English instruction. Sleeping bags and mats can be rented for an extra fee.)

Nomad Tentstay and Yak Packing + with temple and painting tour 2 day

Learn about yaks — herding, packing, milking and more. Plus, learn more about Tibetan culture and art with a temple tour.

Day 1: Meet your yaks in the morning at the lodge, and help with packing. Set out onto the high Lhagang plateau herding the yaks, and then stay with nomads this evening. Bring the whole herd of yaks in, and bring baby yaks into the tents. Enjoy dinner with the family. Day 2: Return to the lodge across the high plateau, stopping for a tour of Nyelum Temple, whose old thangka paintings can teach us about both the history of Tibetan painting and Buddhism. (5-6 hours ride per day. Includes all meals, pack yaks, yak packing and horse tack up instruction, horses, and horse and yak men, nomad homestay and workshop, and English instruction.)

Learn yak milking and rope making, and then set out after packing up the yaks again, for Yibei Lake, a deep sinkhole lake in the highest part of the Lhagang grasslands. Day 3: Ride back to the ecolodge, across wide grasslands, herding yaks the whole way. Includes all meals, pack yaks, yak packing and horse tack up instruction, horses, and horse and yak men, nomad homestay and workshop, and skilled English instruction.

Day 2: Ride past many lakes and visit a small hermitage retreat. Then drop down into a side valley for the night. Day 3: Ride back up onto the plateau, crossing high ridges, some of which require you to lead your horse carefully. Camp by the big Drapa Lake, and a small nomadic village. Day 4: Ride back out of the valley, across the highlands, and then bushwhack, again leading your horse, past cliff lakes, to a small farming village below. Visit the temple and camp nearby. Day 5: Climb back up onto the high plateau and ride to Yibei Lake, a deep sinkhole high on the plateau. Day 6: Ride to a high lookout, and then end at a nomad camp, where you will spend three nights. Day 7-8: Learn about nomad life and get to know the families here. Do dung patty making, yak milking, and rope making. Herd yaks and bring in the baby yaks. Settle into the rhythm of the days. Day 9: Ride or hike back to Khampa Nomad Ecolodge. Includes meals, guide, horses (riding or packing), and tents. Sleeping bags and mats can be rented.

TAGONG RACE RIDE 2025

10 days, 6.5 days riding (minimal hiking)

July 9-18, 2025

Day 1, July 9: Meet in Chengdu and drive to Kangding. Spend the night above the city at hot springs.

Day 2, July 10: Big race day! Drive to Lhakang, a small Tibetan town built around the Lhakang Monastery, surrounded by high grasslands. Mt Zhakra majestically overlooks the mountains and green plains. Attend the horse festival above the town, with morning horse blessings, and then spectacular races of the town, with long races, short sprints, and stunt races.

Day 3, July 11: Acclimatization day. Ride 3 hours near the lodge, meet your horse, and prepare to enter the wilds.

Day 4, July 12: Take a 20 minute car ride to the trailhead at Gyergo Nunnery. Then ride over high Griffon Pass (4900 m) with stunning views of sacred Mt. Zhakra, 5900 m). Then walk down into the back valley to camp at the Zhakra Hotsprings.

Day 5, July 13: Ride today back over Griffon Pass (4900 m). Enjoy the nuns chanting this afternoon, and stay in a basic nunnery homestay with a local family.

Day 6, July 14: Ride up into the high nomad areas. Another lovely day on the horse to end at the home camp of our guides. We will settle in to spend the night at this camp, to be wined and dined by nomads, and experience their traditional life.

Opportunity for nomad tent stay for interested guests.

Day 7, July 15: Spend the morning at Dashika Nomad Camp, enjoying the traditional life. We can try yak milking, butter processing, yak fiber spinning for string and rope, and yak herding. Then ride to Yibei Lake, a high sinkhole (cenote) lake. This is a short 3 hour ride across the high plateau where we will see many nomad camps dotted across the area. Yibei is a Great Lake for swimming, but cold! (3 hour ride, camping, 4450 m)

Day 8, July 16: Ride to high lookout to the west, across wolf and gazelle country and the Lhagang plateau's highest area. Lunch at the lookout, at 4600 m, with views of isolated hermitages nestled in mountains, after mountain, after mountain. Then drop down to see sacred Ragni Lake, home of lammergyer birds in cliffs and the site of many legends. Camp nearby. (5 hour ride, camping, 4200 m)

Day 9, July 17: Ride across the Lhagang Plateau's most populated nomadic area. Some years we happen upon a religious festival in this area. Arrive after lunch to high Genup Gompa, an 300-year-old nomad temple. After visiting the temple, we'll say goodbye to our guides and drive to Khampa Nomad Ecolodge with a quick stop for snacks in Bamei. (5 hour ride, camping, 3800 m)

Day 10, July 18: Return to Chengdu by plane, and on to your destination.

TAGONG RACE RIDE 2025 (difficult)

16 days total, 10.5 days riding/hiking, July 9-24, 2025

This is a very remote, challenging trek for adventurous and experienced riders and hikers. It includes 9 nights of camping in small tents (with a Tibetan-style dining tent). It is stunningly beautiful, and gives a sweet closeness with the rest of the group, the guides, and the horses. Partially yak packing, partially horse packing, due to difficulty of the route.

Day 1, July 9: Meet in Chengdu and drive to Kangding. For centuries it has been the meeting place of Tibetan and Chinese culture, and has served as a tea and yak hide trading center. It serves as last outpost before the wild Tibetan mountains and passes of the Chengdu-Lhasa highway and the Tibetan region of Kham. Spend the night above the city at hot springs.

Day 2, July 10: Big race day! Drive to Lhakang, a small Tibetan town built around the Lhakang Monastery, surrounded by high grasslands. Attend the horse festival above the town, with morning horse blessings, and then spectacular races of the town, with long races, short sprints, and stunt races.

Day 3, July 11: Acclimatization day. Ride 3 hours near the lodge, meet your horse, and prepare to enter the wilds.

Day 4, July 12: Take a 20 minute car ride to the trailhead at Gyergo Nunnery. Then ride over high Griffon Pass (4900 m) with stunning views of sacred Mt. Zhakra, 5900 m). Then walk down into the back valley to camp at the Zhakra Hotsprings.

Day 5, July 13: Hiking day! Hike up from the hot springs and cross over a high pass with close glacier views. This area is very wild and full of animals. Sleep near a high lake.

Day 6, July 14: Ride back to Gyergo Nunnery over the grasslands.

Day 7, July 15: Back in the saddle, ride up into the high nomad areas. Another lovely day on the horse to end at the home yak camp of our guides. We'll watch as the herders bring in the animals, catch and tie the calves, and do the evening milking. Opportunity for a homestay if you like, or just dinner in the black yak hair tents.

Day 8, July 16: Ride across the grasslands to Badi Gompa, a small nomad temple. Pass many small nomadic camps.

Day 9, July 17: Ride in remote areas, past high lakes, to a meditation cave.

Day 10, July 18: Today is a high ridge ride and walk with stunning views in all directions, reaching 4700 meters. There are parts of the ridges that are narrow and require walking the horses. End at Drapa Lake, a beautiful lake in a deep valley, with a small farmer/nomad village, and Choyu speakers.

Day 11, July 19: Retrace our steps back out of the valley, walking part of the way, and then down a steep trail on the other side. We see extremely remote lakes and waterfalls from this barely-there trail. Again, it is necessary to walk the horses. End at a small village with a lovely gold-roofed temple. Camp here.

Day 12, July 20: Back in the easy grasslands, ride back up onto the plateau and to Yibei Lake, a high sinkhole (cenote) lake. Yibei is a great lake for swimming, but cold!

Day 13, July 21: Ride to Genup Gompa, a 300-year old nomad temple. Then take a car to Zhonglu Village, near Danba.

Day 14, July 22: Return to Chengdu by car over Balang Shan, and through Wolong Panda Reserve.

Day 15, July 23: A free day in Chengdu.

Day 16, July 24: Sendoff to the airport.

July 24 - Aug

Day 2, July 25: Start trekking and meet your horses and yaks. Ride 5 hours through a deep gorge with lush forest to a riverside campsite.

Day 3, July 26: Ride up and over a high pass into a land of high lakes. Then camp below in the low forest.

Day 4, July 27: Ride to Zhakra Hotsprings. Spend the afternoon enjoying these medicinal springs with prayer flags all around.

Day 5, July 28: Ride today over high Griffon Pass (4900 m) with stunning views of sacred Mt. Zhakra, 5900 m) onto the high Tibetan plateau to Gyergo Nunnery. Enjoy the nuns chanting this afternoon, and stay in a basic nunnery homestay.

Day 6, July 29: Ride up into the high nomad areas. Another lovely day on the horse to end at the home camp of our guides. We will settle in to spend the night at this camp, to be wined and dined by nomads, and experience their traditional life.

Opportunity for nomad tent stay for interested guests.

Day 7, July 30: Spend the morning at Dashika Nomad Camp, enjoying the traditional life. We can try yak milking, butter processing, yak fiber spinning for string and rope, and yak herding. Then ride to Yibei Lake, a high sinkhole (cenote) lake. This is a short 3 hour ride across the high plateau where we will see many nomad camps dotted across the area. Day 11, Aug 3: Leave early this morning for Shamalong Horse Festival. Attend the morning horse blessings, and then spectacular races of the local clan, with long races, short sprints, and stunt races. Camp near the races for a final night in a tent with your guides.

Day 12, Aug 4: Drive to Chengdu directly from the Festival.

Day 13, Aug 5: A free day in Chengdu.

Day 14, Aug 6: Sendoff to the airport.
